





Community of Inquiry model (COI)




Four roles of the online teacher


Engage with content


Humanised selves




MANAGERIAL

- Structured, easy to find resources










PEDAGOGICAL

 - Explore for and grow knowledge










SOCIAL

 - Mutual rapport + trust










TECHNOLOGICAL


- Purposeful selection of technology
